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2025 Mini Rugby Code of Conduct

FOR SPECTATORS & PARENTS

- Never force a child to play sport.
- Be aware that children should always play sport for the enjoyment they derive from it.
- Encourage your child to always play by the rules/laws emphasizing the importance this plays in maintaining everyone's safety. Make it clear that cheating is just a way to get an unfair advantage.
- Teach your child that winning isn't everything. Playing as well as you can is just as important and only half of the teams on any day can win, so defeat is no disgrace.
- Never yell at any player for making a mistake and never use sarcasm. This will only make him/her feel like a failure. Remember, **HE/SHE IS JUST A CHILD!**
- Set a good example by applauding good play on both sides. Back up the referee and never publicly question his ability or fairness. Children learn best this way.
- Encourage your child to improve his/her skills through coaching.
- Stay off the field. Coaches, referees and medical staff are generally qualified to be there. They are also usually volunteers giving up their time for the love of rugby. Do not confuse your child by coaching him/her from the side-lines; leave the coaching to the coach. Positively encourage at all times.
- Accept advice from first aid and medical staff. Do not force an injured child to continue playing.
- Do not abuse anyone in any form.
- Respect the rights/dignity of every young player regardless of ability, gender, cultural background and religion.

FOR PLAYERS

- Only participate for your own enjoyment, not to please parents or coaches. Enjoy training and match play.
- Always play by the rules and maintain discipline at all times. Safety on the rugby field is of the utmost importance. Cheating is just an unfair way of getting an advantage.
- Improve your skills through training.
- Work hard for yourself and your team and remember to play as a member of the team and not for personal glory.
- Always show good sportsmanship and applaud the efforts of others. Remember that winning isn't everything. Playing as well as you can is just as important.
- Respect match officials. These are often volunteers doing this for the love of rugby. Do not publicly question their fairness or ability and never abuse a match official.
- Be honest with medical staff. They have your safety and long-term rugby career as their main focus.
- Rugby is all about **FRIENDSHIP, TEAMWORK and COMRADERY.**
- Do not abuse officials, other players, coaches or spectators, verbally or otherwise. Co-operate at all times with coaches, team mates, opposition and medical staff.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- **HAVE FUN!!**
